Sept. 14th, 2004— Speaker 7:30 Birding in Mexico

Darrell Lee will tell about his trip to Mexico this past May, driving his mini-van from here to Colima, Colima (Mexico). It's a hard-core birder and ecology talk. Margaret McClune and he drove through five Mexican states and got as far as 1200 miles below the border, joining up with two Georgia birders in Mazatlan and birding in the states of Sinaloa, Nayarit, Jalisco, and Colima. They each saw about 245 bird species, with about 90 lifers.

Directions: Take the Green Valley exit from eastbound or westbound I-80 and go north to the first road which is Business Center Road. Turn west and head toward the Costco store which is northwest of the junction of I-80 and I-680. The Board of Education Building is on the right side of the road before you reach Costco. If you're coming north on I-680, take the Cordelia Road exit and make three right turns to go under the highway and north on Green Valley Road which is the frontage road west of I-80. Go over I-80 and make a left turn on Business Center Rd. **Please go inside the building and go to the Waterman Room.**


Come to Where the Birds Are!

Morro Bay Winter Bird Festival, January 14-17, 2005

Migrate to one of the country's pre-eminent birding spots and join the Morro Coast Audubon Society (MCAS) for the 8th Annual Morro Bay Winter Bird Festival. Morro Bay --located on California's scenic Central Coast -- is an important stop on the Pacific Flyway, and is recognized worldwide for its diversity of both resident and wintering birds. At last year's festival, 213 species of birds were identified!

The Morro Bay Winter Bird Festival is sponsored by MCAS and gives you the chance to join local and national birding experts on a variety of field trips and workshops. Field trip group sizes are limited to maximize spotting and identification opportunities. The Festival also offers workshops aimed at sharpening your birding skills, as well as evening programs with outstanding speakers.

DESTINATION LOCATION: Meet at the Vallejo Carpool location at 8:30 a.m.. We will be proceeding to Wetlands Edge Road, American Canyon for a morning of birding.

We are fortunate to have on our Board of Directors, John Robinson who is with the US Forest Service, Ecosystem Conservation. John is the creator of Lanius Software, Inc. and the author of a birding CD-ROM. John has many years of birding experience and some of you may have had the pleasure of being on a birding field trip he has led for Wild Bird Center. Come and join John as he introduces beginning birders to shorebirds. If you already know your birds, come and experience another season of coastal bird migration in a location you may not be familiar with. Sandpiper Point is not what it use to be, as the reeds and cordgrass fill in the mud flat making it harder to see shorebirds. However, we now have Wetland Edge Road, and it will be a welcome surprise to view shorebirds. We may see raptors, and perhaps a falcon or two. This is a half day trip with little walking.



President's Perch

(as in where a bird sits – not the fish)

It has been a busy first month as President of Napa-Solano Audubon Society. The Board has updated the Constitution and Bylaws, performed an inventory of the physical assets of the Chapter, authorized the purchase of binoculars for our Education program, and taken the first steps to convert to all electronic record keeping.

In addition, the first organizational meeting for the SOLANO COUNTY Breeding Bird Atlas project was conducted on July 14 under the leadership of Robin Leong, Project Director. It was inspiring to see interested people from all around the Bay area attend the meeting and bring their ideas and enthusiasm to the project. Robin and others will provide many details on the project in future issues of the Song Sparrow. The bottom line is we learned a lot while conducting the Napa County breeding bird project and will build on our successes and learn from our problems. Due to the growth of online information resources some things that were cumbersome and expensive have become much easier and far less expensive – big examples are detailed mapping and data processing.

The Solano County Breeding Bird Atlas will be the central focus of our chapter efforts for the next few years. Birders and non-birders will be able to participate through fieldwork, data entry, graphic design, educational activities, public outreach, publicity, and in many other ways. For example, part of the public outreach will be bird box building and placement. A non-birding spouse has volunteered to lead this effort.

Field trips for the upcoming year have been planned, many with a focus on Solano County and other aspects of the breeding bird project. For example, weekday neighborhood birding walks will be conducted in each of the major cities in Solano County. Of course, we will still have

field trips in many other popular areas in Napa County and around California.

Many of our volunteers have used this summer to hone their already impressive skills at chapter-sponsored events. At the July 24 field trip planning meeting held at Uzelle Williams' bird friendly home, our already top notch field trip leaders were treated to a highly informative talk on Helpful Hints for Guiding Outdoor Nature Tours by Teri Engbring of Yolo Basin Foundation. Three members under the auspices of the chapter's Education program will attend a one-day training session in Davis at the Yolo Wildlife Area where they will be trained in environmental education.

I am very enthusiastic about the future of Napa-Solano Audubon Society. We have a solid financial base which increases with every new Friends membership submitted, a core of dedicated volunteers, and a hard working Board willing to make the tough decisions for a vigorous organization. We have an untapped pool of expertise and volunteer effort among the 650+ members of the chapter. We have a key project - the Solano County Breeding bird Atlas around which we can focus our efforts. Now we need as many chapter members as possible to step up and step out to meet these challenges. We have real volunteer jobs for real people for a real purpose.

Let us all work together to meet our goal of becoming the best environmental organization focusing on Napa and Solano counties.

Book Review Sierra Birds, a Hiker's Guide by, John Muir Laws

Whether you're an experienced birder or just beginning, this pocket size guide is a perfect addition to your birding library. The 4.5" x 8.75"x 1/4" dimensions make it easy to stick in a back pocket or a backpack for a handy reference while walking in the Sierra Nevada.

The book is easy to use too. It is arranged by bird color and size, with color tabs on the pages for fast and easy reference. The full color illustrations are accurate and I appreciated how the distinctive features are identified. This is an excellent book for quick reference use in the field. My sister and I used it while kayaking on the Napa River to identify a young Black-crowned Night-Heron. Over 200 species are represented.
