March 8th Meeting Program: Northern California Birds in Motion

Larry Arbanas of Earthwhile Nature Productions will give his video presentation, Northern California Birds in Motion . Larry has been shooting bird and nature projects since 1989 and this one will give Napa-Solano Audubon members a chance to see some familiar birds close up. By using the same lens and camera that bring NFL action and Olympic figure skating into our living rooms, Larry has been able to get views of California birds that even the best binoculars and scopes cannot see. You can expect to see White-tailed Kites, Burrowing Owls, Virginia and Clapper Rails and many other birds during this 45-minute video. Larry lives in the East Bay and is presently acquiring bird videos for the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, US Fish and Wildlife Service, Watchable Wildlife (represents the 38 CA Nature Festivals), and hopefully the Point Reyes Bird Observatory.

April 12th Meeting Program: Condor Tales

Sanford R. "Sandy" Wilbur, who led the California condor research and recovery efforts from 1969 to 1981, will discuss the condor and his new book, "Condor Tales: What I Learned in Twelve Years with the Big Birds." The book traces the history of the condor from Pleistocene times until the decision was made to take condors into captivity for a captive breeding and reestablishment program. Sandy uses information seldom heard in other condor presentations to describe the reasons for the condors' endangerment, and to show the history of human involvement with the condors. He will be reading selections from "Condor Tales."

Sandy spent 34 years with the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, in various capacities with the National Wildlife Refuge System, Patuxent Wildlife Research Center, and the Federal Endangered Species Program. He is the author of five books and many publications of birds and other wildlife and conservation subjects. Since retiring from the Fish and

<u>DESTINATION LOCATION:</u> We will proceed to the one-lane bridge & fisherman parking pullout area, 1.2 miles from McDonalds Restaurant. Time: 8:30 am.

"From northbound Hwy I-80 in south Fairfield, take Hwy 12 exit east toward Suisun City. From southbound Hwy I-80 in Fairfield, exist at Abernathy Road exit; turn left onto Chadbourne road and follow signs to eastbound entrance to Hwy 12. Proceed east 4.2 miles, turn left (north) on to Sunset Ave.. Sunset Ave. ends at Hwy 12 and Grizzly Island Road begins on the south."

"Grizzly Island is actually a number of wildlife areas scattered throughout the Suisun Marsh and managed by the California Department of Fish and Game...the area is managed as waterfowl habitat and for duck hunting." *

Suisun Marsh has been designated as a globally important site by the California Important Bird Area Program.

Bring snacks and liquids. Pack a lunch. The trip should end around 2:00 pm. Rain Cancels.

Trip Report: Sacramento NWR and Gray Lodge WR

On a beautiful clear Saturday, November 13, 2004, twenty four NSAS members and friends trekked north to bird these two fantastic wildlife refuges. We were treated to the sight and sounds of tens of thousands of wintering ducks and geese. There were more (approximately 200,000) Snow, Whitefronted, Canada and Ross' geese there earlier than I have seen in years. When a large flock rose in unison it was an unforgettable and breathtaking sensory experience only to be outdone in California in the Klamath Basin. Highlights of the day, in addition to all the geese and ducks, were an American Bittern flying, a field of several hundred White-faced Ibis feeding, several Eurasion Wigeon dabbling off the viewing platform at Sacramento NWR and the beautiful sight of the Sandhill Cranes setting their wings and settling into Gray Lodge WR at sunset. A memorable day with at least 81 species sighted. You should have been there. We missed you.

DESTINATION LOCATION AND TIME:

Rush Creek Trailhead, 9:00 am. From Vallejo, take Hwy 37 to Hwy 101, go north, exit at Atherton Avenue, turn left onto Binford Road. Park in the "Park and Ride" lot on the left, or along Binford Road near the trailhead.

Mike Rippey to Receive Environmental Award

The Napa County Sierra Club will be honoring former Supervisor Mike Rippey with the presentation of the Earl Thollander Environmental Award at a dinner in Yountville on April 23rd.

Mike's leadership in transforming a traditional flood control project into a combined environmental restoration and flood protection plan for the Napa River has been recognized at state and national levels. He also headed ballot campaigns to create a Napa County Parks and Open Space District, and worked to protect and restore Coombsville's ground water. But his efforts for local wildlife, agricultural preservation, and parks and open space began years before his election as Fifth District Supervisor in 1992.

Mike is a wildlife biologist and co-author of the book 'Breeding Birds of Napa County'. With the Audubon Society and others, he worked to protect farm and wild lands in Napa and Solano counties from destructive developments.

Mike was a leader of the fight against 1990's Measure K, which would have created a new regional landfill in American Canyon. After that ballot measure lost, the land was sold back to its earlier owner and eventually given to the Land Trust of Napa County. This heavily wooded canyon is now Newell Wildlife Preserve.

According to Carol Kunze, Chair of the Napa Sierra Club, the award was instituted as a memorial to Earl Thollander, Napa Valley artist and author of 'Back Roads of California'. In previous years, Harold Kelly, Ginny Simms and Ralph Ingols were chosen for the honor. Kelly and Simms were recognized for their decades of work for agriculture and growth management. Ingols was honored for his work for native plant habitat, including creation of the botanical garden at Skyline Park.
