New President for National Audubon Society

The National Audubon Society has announced that David Yarnold had been named its new President and Chief Executive Officer. A passionate conservationist, Yarnold has served as Executive Director of Environmental Defense Fund and President of Environmental Defense Action Fund. Prior to that, he was a Pulitzer Prize-winning editor at the San Jose Mercury News.

"David brings proven leadership in the for-profit and non-profit sectors to Audubon at a time when efforts to protect birds, habitats and the resources that sustain us are needed more than ever;" said Holt Thrasher, Audubon's Board Chair. "His leadership ability, his passion for conservation and grassroots action, his communications skills and his organizational expertise all make him the perfect fit for the Audubon of 2010 and beyond."

Yarnold has been at EDF since April 2005, where he was responsible for all operations, from programs, to development and marketing/communications. Yarnold's *San Jose Mercury News* was consistently ranked as one of America 's 10 Best Newspapers. He was also one of three Pulitzer Prize finalists for editorial writing in 2005. He will assume the Presidency of Audubon on Sept 1.

64th Benicia Christmas Bird Count December 20th

The 64th Benicia Christmas Bird Count (CBC) will be held on Monday Dec 20. What is a CBC? It's a fun citizens science count of all of the birds seen or heard within a 15 mile diameter circle for a 24 hour period. The center of the circle is 1 1/4 miles north of Pierce Lane on Hwy 680. It was established by Benician Emerson Stoner, in 1930. Don't be turned off by the name, Benicia CBC, as besides Benicia, it covers part of Martinez, most of Vallejo, Green Valley, and Cordelia. How can you help? Everyone can help. What we need are eyes and ears. We need spotters, data recorders, beginner to expert birders, folks that are willing to count their bird feeders (if your live within the count circle) and volunteers to help set up our CBC dinner Potluck. Email David at davidtakeuchi@aol.com (enter: "Subject: Field Trip"). Bring snacks, liquids, and pack a lunch. Recommendations: wear a hat, bring sunscreen and bug repellent. Dress in layers. Don't forget your binoculars! Heavy rain cancels. Non-members are welcome on most field trips.

CARPOOL LOCATIONS: Cordelia: Solano County Office of Education parking lot (5100 Business Center Drive, Fairfield) near Costco. Vallejo: Old Wal-Mart parking lot across from Baskin-Robbins (5182 Sonoma Blvd.). Napa: Riverpark Shopping Center; by Sweeney's Sports,, 1537 W. Imola Avenue.

Check the details for the specific trip to see which carpool locations will be used for that trip. The carpool times listed are departure times. Finally, carpoolers will share driving expenses. The recommended reimbursement rate to the driver is $30\ c/mile$, to be split by the number of riders, excluding the driver. Please arrive early.

Field Trip Tubbs Island San Pablo Bay Lands Saturday, September 18, 2010

DESTINATION LOCATION/TIME: Tubbs Island, 8:30 AM -2:00 PM. Going west on Hwy 37, make a u-turn at Hwy 121 traffic light and double back going east on Hwy 37 about 1/4 of a mile to the parking lot on the right. **Critical to be on time.** The gate keeps out automobile traffic, however, for this event, it will be opened to let us drive in. We will go in and leave as a group. We will drive 2.5 miles in and walk around the ponds and scope the shoreline.

GENERAL INFO: You will be provided a hands on visual experience of marsh, shore birds, and plants supported by marsh land and the salt waters of the bay. We anticipate seeing migrating ducks and shorebirds. Tubbs has a healthy population of the endangered California clapper rail. We will lunch in-the-field. Pack snacks, liquids, and backpack a lunch. It's always a good idea to wear a hat and bring sunscreen. Dress in layers. Don't forget your binoculars.

Field Trip Tennessee Valley, Marin County Saturday, October 16, 2010

DESTINATION LOCATION/TIME: Tennessee Valley Parking Lot, 9:00 AM, ending around 2:00 PM.

DIRECTIONS: Head west on CA-37 to CA-101 south. Follow CA-101 south and take the Mill Valley / Stinson Beach / Hwy. 1 exit. Follow Shoreline Hwy. until you see the Tennessee Valley Road sign, the turn off will be on the **left**. Drive 1.6 miles to the parking lot at the end of the road.

CARPOOL LOCATION: Napa: 8:00AM or **Vallejo:** 8:00 AM

ey.htm . "Tennessee Valley is an amazing offshoot of the Marin Headlands, with hiking trails that suit the whole family. The Tennessee Valley Trail is mostly level; it begins at the parking area and travels 1.7 miles to Tennessee Beach. For the more adventurous hiker, there are a number of other trails leading into the hills above Tennessee Valley... Tennessee Valley contain a bevy of wildlife; from mighty raptors to common swallows, the birds of the valley will keep your eyes on the skies. The skies are not the only place to view wildlife; the valley is teeming with deer, coyote, and on an occasion you might even see a bobcat."

Field Trip to Gray Lodge Wildlife Area Butte County November 13, 2010

DESTINATION LOCATION/ TIME: 9:15 AM, Gray Lodge Wildlife Area, 3207 Rutherford Road, Gridley, CA 95948. Meet at the Check Station. Ends 2:00PM.

DIRECTIONS: From I-80 East, take CA-113 North towards Woodland, take exist 538 and continue on CA-113 N towards Yuba City, take Highway 99 north to Live Oak. Turn west on Pennington (North Butte) Road. Turn right on Almond Orchard Avenue and continue to entrance. The distance from Live Oak is about eight miles. Driving time from Cordelia is about 1 hour 45 minutes. For detailed driving instructions, check with CSAA.com, mapquest, or your GPS. Be aware that the different web sites will give different directions.

CARPOOL: Napa: 6:30 AM; Cordelia: 7:00 AM

GENERAL INFO: Join a guided tour at 10:00AM; afterwards we will have lunch followed by more birding.
