#### **Monitoring on Your Own eBird**

eBird is a web site created by the Cornell University Lab of Ornithology and the National Audubon Society where you can login and maintain your birding records in an international shared database of bird observations. This makes your records part of a permanent, enormous pool of data that can be accessed by a global community of educators, ornithologists, land planners, etc. eBird offers benefits to you as well: your data is organized consistently, and you can see your records in new ways, with interactive maps, graphs, etc. Best of all, you can view the birds that have been seen by others in a particular area you plan to visit. Obviously the eBird data becomes more valuable the more people use it. That is why we would like to enlist a lot more people to start adding their records to eBird for Napa and Solano Counties. ## **Monthly Field Trips**

Field trip details are provided below for <u>3 trips</u> from Dec 2010 –Feb 2011. Unless otherwise indicated, the following applies to all field trips:

**COORDINATOR:** David Takeuchi (707) 643-5544. David is the Coordinator for all Field Trips. If calling and want a return call, leave the city of your return phone number. Email David at davidtakeuchi@aol.com (enter: "Subject: Field Trip").

Bring snacks and liquids, and pack a lunch. It's always a good idea to wear a hat, bring sunscreen and bug repellent. Dress in layers. Don't forget your binoculars! Heavy rain cancels. Non-members are welcome on most field trips.

#### **CARPOOL LOCATIONS:**

<u>Cordelia</u>: Solano County Office of Education parking lot (5100 Business Center Drive, Fairfield) near Costco.

<u>Vallejo</u>: Old Wal-Mart parking lot across from Baskin-Robbins (5182 Sonoma Blvd.). From Sonoma Blvd., turn east at the Meadows Drive traffic light.

<u>Napa</u>: Riverpark Shopping Center; by Sweeney's Sports, 1537 W. Imola Avenue, between Coombs and Jefferson Streets.

Check the details for the specific trip to see which carpool locations will be used for that trip. The Carpool times listed are departure times. Please arrive early. Finally, carpoolers will share driving expenses. The recommended rate of reimbursement to the driver is 30 cents per mile, to be split by the number of riders, excluding the driver.

**DIRECTIONS:** Meet at the Vallejo Carpool location by the old WalMart across from Baskin Robbins/Food 4

**GENERAL INFO:** Benicia Christmas Count will be held on Monday, December 20. Pre-count can be done for 3 days consecutive days before count day and post-count is done for 3 days after count day. Robin is our Christmas Count Compiler and we will be checking out various areas in the count circle to adding birds we may not see on count day. Pack a lunch. Be prepared to bird till 2:00 PM.

**CARPOOL LOCATION AND TIME:** Napa , 7:30 AM. Vallejo , 8:00 AM.

#### FIELD TRIP WOODBRIDGE ROAD STATEN ISLAND to see CRANES Saturday, Jan. 15, 2011

**LEADER:** David Yee

DESTINATION LOCATION/TIME. DIRECTIONS:

9:00 AM at the Carl's Jr. Restaurant near the corner of Hwy 12 and Starr Road / N. Thornton Road. Take Hwy 12 towards Lodi , go through the I-5 underpass, and take a right at the stop light.

CARPOOL LOCATIONS: Napa: 7:00 AM; Vallejo: carpool from Cordelia; Cordelia/Suisun: 7:30 AM

GENERAL INFO: We are fortunate to have David Yee, San Joaquin County's preeminent birder, and international birding guide, take us on a birding adventure to some of his favorite birding sites. We will be looking for both the greater and lesser sandhill cranes at Woodbridge Road and Staten Island. Aleutian Canada geese which were uncommon can now be seen in the tens of thousands. We will visit various other locations to look for wintering water fowl, shorebirds and land birds. Pack a lunch. We should be ending by 2:00 PM.

#### FIELD TRIP TO CHADBOURNE ROAD CORDELIA Saturday, February 12, 2011

LEADER: David Takeuchi

**DESTINATION LOCATION/TIME:** International Bird Research Rescue Center Fairfield/Suisun (IBRRS) Wastewater Treatment Plant. The field trip will end about 2:00 PM.

**DIRECTIONS:** Meet at the Solano County Office of Education Parking lot, 5100 Business Center Drive, Fairfield . (Cordelia carpool location) at 8:00 am.

CARPOOL LOCTIONS: Napa : departs at 7:30 am; Cordelia/Suisun: 8:00 am.

**GENERAL INFO:** We will be taken the tour by IBRRS volunteer, and NSAS member, Karen Sheldon. After the 1971 collision of two Standard Oil tankers beneath the Golden Gate Bridge and the loss of hundreds of birds, a small group of volunteers started the IBRRS. It's primary goals were developing oiled wildlife response, cleaning and rehabilitation techniques and promoting ongoing research in this field.

Following the tour, we'll visit the Waste Water Treatment Plant. The plant plays an important environmental role in treating wastewater for release into the Suisun Marsh. This is one of the best sites to study duck identification because of the variety and close range.

Then we'll take a slow ride down Chadbourne Rd. and side roads to look for raptors and passerines. Bring a lunch/snacks and water.

#### **Additional Friday Field Trips**

In addition to the field trips above, our weekly Friday Bird Walks will continue throughout the spring. A carpool meets at the regular Napa location at 8AM each Friday (see "Monthly Field Trips" for carpool locations). Visitors are most welcome! An email goes out to a special list of "Friday birders" a couple days prior to the trip describing the destination for the week. #### How the CBC Helps Protect Species and Their Habitat



The data collected by observers over the past century allow researchers, conservation biologists, and other interested individuals to study the long-term health and status of bird populations across North America. When combined with other surveys such as the Breeding Bird Survey, it provides a picture of how the continent's bird populations have changed in time and space over the past hundred years.

The long-term perspective made possible by the Christmas Bird Count is vital for conservationists. It informs strategies to protect birds and their habitat - and helps identify environmental issues with implications for people as well. For example, local trends in bird populations can indicate habitat fragmentation or signal an immediate environmental threat, such as groundwater contamination or poisoning from improper use of pesticides.

In the 1980's CBC data documented the decline of wintering populations of the American Black Duck, after which conservation measures were put into effect to reduce hunting pressure on this species. More recently, in 2009, the data were instrumental in Audubon's Birds & Climate Change analysis, which documented range shifts of bird species over time.

# How the CBC Helps Protect Species and Their Habitat (cont'd)

In 2007, the data were instrumental in the development of two Audubon State of the Birds Reports - Common Birds in Decline, which revealed that some of America's most beloved and familiar birds have taken a nosedive over the past forty years, and WatchList 2007, which identified 178 rarer species in the continental U.S. and 39 in Hawaii that are imperiled. These three reports helped scientists and policy-makers to both identify threats to birds and habitat, and promote broad awareness of the need to address them. #### **Christmas Bird Counts**

Christmas Bird Counts are 1-day events sponsored by Audubon chapters across the country. Each Christmas count takes place sometime during a 3-week period beginning in mid-December, and focuses on a fixed area defined by a 15-mile diameter circle. Teams of birders are assigned to specific areas within the circle, where they record the species and estimate the numbers seen. Napa-Solano Audubon organizes 2 different counts: The Benicia Christmas Count, December 20, 2010, in Solano County, and the Angwin Christmas Count, January 1, 2011, in Napa County.
