New Workshops with Bird Walks

Last year was great fun as we launched our Beginning Birding Walks at American Canyon Wetlands, and this year holds yet even more learning opportunities. In addition to hosting these free monthly walks, NSAS will present short workshops just prior to the walks. Workshops and activities will usually **start at 9am** near the **American Canyon Wetlands parking lot** on the dates listed below, and will end around noon. The walks are on flat ground, and appropriate for all ages (children must be accompanied by an adult). We expect to see more than 30 different species of birds. So, come join us! For more info, check our website or contact Wendy at napa-solano-birds@outlook.com. Walks and discussion topics include:

Dec 7 (10 a.m.) Intro to Christmas Bird Count (CBC) –

We'll discuss the rich history of the CBC and how the data has been used in Audubon's conservation efforts. We will then try a practice CBC by taking a census of the birds we see on our walk.

Jan 11: Hummingbirds @ Home - We will learn about a citizen science project that is not only gathering information about hummingbirds, but focusing on the habitat upon which they rely. Participants of the workshop will receive a 'Hummingbirds at Home' kit, including wildflower seeds of native California flowers, materials for creating a hummingbird feeder from recycled materials, and more.

Feb 15: The Great Backyard Bird Count - This weekend is the national Audubon Great Backyard Bird Count weekend! We will see how you can help scientists better understand the world around us by recording the birds that you see in your backyard.

March 1: Basic bird identification - How do the experts tell all the different species apart? Hear tips for finding and identifying typical California birds, including how to identify a bird just from its silhouette!

April 5: Bird song - Why do birds sing? How can you tell birds apart by their songs? You will learn to ID five different birds from their song alone, and discuss apps for your smartphone that can help you learn more songs and identify birds in your yard and in the field.

May 3: Nesting - What are the different kinds of nests that birds build? Try your hand at building a nest yourself. Find out about active nests with living birds that you can watch from your computer. Several different types of nests will be available for you to look at up close, and we will watch for more nests on our walk.

Tuesday, January 14, 7 p.m. - "Freeway Birding: San Francisco to Seattle"

Freeway Birding author Harry G. Fuller is an unrelentingly devoted birder. For over two decades he has shared his passion by leading field trips in California, Oregon and Washington. Join Harry as he shows you how and where to find the birds within a few miles of the freeway corridor, so that one or more short stints of birding can be easily worked into your interstate travels on the I-5 corridor and beyond.

Tuesday, February 11, 7 p.m. - "The Birds of Borneo"

Borneo is a land of contrasts from the monoculture palm plantations to ancient primal rain forests. We will take a look at the diversity of wildlife including the Orangutans and Proboscis monkeys to the bird life. Come join the always entertaining John Glover on a journey to an area of great beauty that is under tremendous environmental stress.

Tuesday, March 11, 7 p.m. - "Projects of the Solano Land Trust"

Hear about Solano Land Trust's work to permanently protect natural areas, working farms, and ranchlands in Solano County, and connect our community to these lands. Meetings begin at **7 pm** with about 15 minutes of social time, sharing of birding experiences and refreshments, and finally, a special presentation or guest speaker. Non-members are welcome.

"Pre-Christmas Bird Count Scouting" – Sat., Dec. 14.
Napa carpool leaves at 7:30 a.m. and meets in Vallejo at Baskin-Robbins at 8:00 a.m. Return at noon.
Join Robin Leong and Phil Gulley for this year's scouting for the Benicia Christmas Count. The pre-count can be done for 3 consecutive days before the count day, and post-count is done for 3 days after the count day. Robin and Phil will lead us through various areas in the count circle to add birds we may not see on count day. We will preview Benicia State Recreation Area (park fee) and parts of Vallejo. We'll bird for half a day.

"Sierra Valley" – Sat., Jan. 4. Napa carpool leaves Sweeny's Sports at 7 a.m. and returns before 8 p.m. unless group wants to stop for dinner. If inclement weather, we will bird in Yolo Basin Wildlife area.

Join us as we explore the Sierra Valley with leader Bruce Webb. Sierra Valley is a huge valley at approximately 5,000 ft elevation with vast tracts of pastureland and expanses of tall sagebrush and is known for large numbers of wintering raptors. From Truckee we will carpool north on Hwy 89 to enter the spectacular Sierra Valley at the town of Sierraville. We will start the New Year with panoramas of mountains and closeup views of wintering raptors, including Golden and Bald eagles, Prairie Falcon, Merlin (we will study each one), Rough-legged, and Ferruginous Hawks in their various color morphs. Dress warmly with knit caps and gloves. Will stop in Truckee for snack or lunch to eat on the road up to Sierraville. Bring: \$s for carpool gas, comfortable walking shoes, binoculars, warm layers. "Woodbridge Road, Staten Island and 8-Mile Road"—Sat., Feb. 8. Napa carpool leaves from Sweeny's Sports at 7 a.m. and stop in Cordelia at 7:30 Trip ends 2 p.m. Join David Yee for a day in the Delta to see the Sandhill Cranes, possible Tundra Swans and the many species of ducks, geese and water birds that flock the Pacific Flyway in winter. This will be mainly a driving trip, with stopping and brief walking along country roads. Bring: Lunch, \$s for carpool gas, comfortable walking shoes, binoculars, layers. "Elkhorn Slough and Moonglow Dairy" - Saturday, March 15. Leave 8 a.m. and return 5 p.m Join us at the Elkhorn Slough National Estuarine Research Reserve, MoonGlow Dairy and more. This family-friendly Reserve has a visitor center with great exhibits, helpful staff, nature store, and guided tours. We will take one of the tours and then go out on our own to many birding spots in the area. A number of birds nest here including the white-tailed kite, redshouldered hawk, barn owl, chestnut-backed chickadee, swallow and oak titmouse. We may also stop at nearby Kirby Park. A number of rare birds have been spotted here including a lesser flamingo very recently. In the past, visitors have seen the white-faced ibis, tufted duck, long-eared owl, yellow loon, lesser yellowlegs, least sandpipers, widgeon, phalarope and more. Bring: Lunch, \$s for carpool gas, comfortable walking shoes, binoculars, layers. Contact: Carol Boykin at carol.boykin@att.net.
