Upcoming Field Trips

Panoche Valley and Los Banos Wildlife Area – Saturday, March 16 - Sunday, March 17, 2013

Tucked away in the Coast Range just east of Pinnacles National Park is a valley of birding splendor. It is a premier winter birding spot for uncommon and sometimes hard to find species such as Mountain Plover, Long-eared Owl, Cassin's Kingbird, Sage Thrasher, Mountain Bluebird, and Greater Roadrunner. Other possibilities include Golden Eagle, Ferruginous Hawk, Prairie Falcon, Rock Wren, and Vesper, Lark, and Sage Sparrow.

Bodega Bay - Sunday, April 14

With very diverse habitats, this area attracts a wide variety of birds. Along with the open ocean and harbor, there are extensive mudflats, beaches, rocky shore, salt marsh at the southeast end of the lagoon, tidal ponds, eucalyptus groves, and varied bushy vegetation. Birds range from loons and grebes, to waterfowl, to shorebirds, and seabirds.

Putah Creek - Saturday, May 18

Dr. Manfred Kusch, retired from UC Davis, has lived the last 22 years along the south bank of Putah Creek. Dr. Kusch has turned part of his property into a private bird preserve that includes large riparian woodland. Varied habitats attract many species of wintering and breeding birds. The tour is about two hours with a one-mile walk over mildly uneven terrain along the creek. This trip will be limited to 12 people. A signup will be available in April.

North Lake Tahoe – Sat, June 15 – Sun, June 16

North Lake Tahoe is not only one of the state's majestic getaways, it is home to a plethora of mountain bird species. Species we hope to find include White-headed Woodpecker, Williamson's Sapsucker, Clark's Nutcracker, Mountain Chickadee, Townsend's Solitaire, Green-tailed Towhee, Brewer's Sparrow, Evening Grosbeak, Cassin's Finch. The Sooty Grouse, Blacked-backed Woodpecker, Gray Flycatcher, and Pine Grosbeak are also possibilities.

General Meetings and Programs Second Tuesday, Monthly

General Meetings are usually held on the second Tuesday of most months at The Florence Douglas Senior Center, 333 Amador St., Vallejo (see map on our website). Meetings begin at 7 pm with about 15 minutes of social time, sharing of birding experiences and refreshments, and finally, a special presentation or guest speaker. Non-members are welcome.

March and April Programs

Our guest speaker for the March 12th general meeting will be Rich Cimino, an experienced birder and Yellowbilled Tours Field Guide from the Bay Area. Rich will present a program on Birds of Nome, Alaska and will show us digital photos and maps of the many species seen on his annual tours of Nome, Alaska. He covers a wide variety of habitats in the Nome area, including coastal lagoons, tundra wetlands and spruce forests. Most of the birds are in their resplendent breeding plumages – rarely, if ever, seen in the "lower 48".

On **April 9th**, our guest speaker will be naturalist and author David Lukas. David will present a program on **How Birds Work**. This program will cover the intricate ways that bones, feathers, and muscles all work together to help birds fly and live in their environments. If you've ever found a bird feather or bone and wondered what you could learn from it, then this presentation will give you some key insights and ideas of what to look for. You'll never see birds the same way again!

The work on the publication of the *Solano County Breeding Bird Atlas* has begun in earnest and is progressing well. We are still focused on a December publication date and are keeping to that schedule. Research and analysis is ongoing, the writing is underway, and photos are beginning to be collected. Thank you to all the photographers who are contributing great images of many of the more than 150 species to be covered in the book.

Fundraising for the printing costs (the single most expensive item) is off to a good start, with more than 40 species sponsored to date. The Solano Land Trust, LSA Associates, and Zynga have also made recent contributions.
